Your rights

This project is voluntary. You do not have to answer any questions that you do not wish to answer. You may stop your participation at any time during the interview. Your contact information such as address and telephone number will not be disclosed to the public.

Deposit of materials

You will agree to have the video recording stored at the UConn School of Law Special Collections & Archives. You will have to sign a release form for the UConn School of Law. The video recording will be available for use by researchers and patrons. The materials may also be used for public display or publication by the UConn School of Law Special Collections & Archives.
